



Regulations of the Intensive Polish Language Course (IPLC) at the University of Warsaw 2019

I. BENEFICIARIES

- 1. The course is dedicated to students of last 4 semesters of Master degree at the University of Warsaw admitted to programmes conducted in English language.
- 2. Each participant of the IPLC is obligated to submit a signed declaration of participation in the IPLC.

II. DURATION AND STRUCTURE

§ 2

- 1. The Intensive Polish Language Course (IPLC) starts on September 16th, 2019 and finishes on September 27th, 2019.
- 2. It includes 48 hours of classes of Polish language containing 40 hours of linguistic skills and 8 hours of cultural classes (conducted in English).
- 3. All classes are conducted at basic level.

III. ADMISSIONS

- 1. Admissions will be held online through the COME platform and will be available for each student meeting the criteria.
- 2. Information about the course will be published on UW websites and delivered to potential candidates via e-mail.
- 3. Acceptance to the course will be determined by order of applications.
- 4. Candidates who will not manage to sign up for the course on time will be put on the reserve list.
- 5. Participant who resign from the course later than 10 days before the commencement of the course, will not be allowed to take part in any other activity organized by the Welcome Point UW during the academic year 2019/2020.













IV. PAYMENT

Participation in the Intensive Polish Language Course is free of charge. The course is organized within University's Integrated Development Programme and funded by European Social Fund.

V. CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

To complete the Intensive Polish Language Course with a positive result, the participant has to attend classes and participate actively, do the homework and assignments on time; 10 hours of unexcused absence during the whole course is acceptable. Absences caused by illness should be confirmed by a certificate from a doctor.

Evaluation of the course will be made on basis of the pre-test and post-test which are mandatory. Students who finish the course with a positive result will receive a certificate of participation.
